Dear Professor Doctor Chang Ung

It is with great pleasure that I report back on some of the activities of the Taekwon-Do Federation of Africa ("TFA").

As you already know, the TFA has successfully established a full-time International Taekwon-Do Centre under the guidance of a full-time instructor: Senior Master Kim Jong Su. The Centre has been made available to all students in South Africa and we are proud to report that numerous students have trained at the facility under the guidance of Senior Master Kim Jong Su.

Senior Master Kim Jong Su is instrumental to the success of the TFA thus far and is playing a major part in actively promoting Taekwon-Do on the continent of Africa. Although most of the activities of the TFA are, due to financial constraints, currently focussed on the development of Taekwon-Do in South Africa, Senior Master Kim Jong Su has visited Mozambique to present a very successful seminar to numerous students. Madagascar has also expressed an interest in inviting Senior Master Kim Jong Su to present a seminar. It is hoped that the Federation will be able to raise the necessary funds to send Senior Master Kim Jong Su to other African Countries to present technical seminars.

The TFA has also successfully introduced sparring and pattern tournaments on a regular basis. We have named the tournament the "Innovation Tournament" to signify the aims of the TFA to develop Taekwon-Do on the continent of Africa. At these tournaments we aim to provide students with competition experience and also to assist with the development of umpires and centre referees. At a recent tournament we focussed on developing the skills of female centre referees. This initiative was met with a lot of enthusiasm.

Under the guidance and leadership of Senior Master Kim Jong Su, we have also established the Tong-Il Taekwondo School in an endeavour to attract more students to the sport. Although we have already managed to attract a number of students, the school is still in the beginning phase. It is hoped that the school will develop further into a successful endeavour.

The TFA has also brought out a newsletter which is circulated amongst all NGB's on the continent. It is hoped that this newsletter will unite the continent and that it will bring about a greater awareness of the activities of the TFA.

The TFA also wishes to make mention of the hard work and dedication of our acting Secretary General: Bsb Ronel Rust. Without her hard work the TFA would not have been able to hold numerous tournaments and other events.

I attach hereto a schedule of some of the activities of the TFA for your kind attention. You will note that the TFA endeavours to include all the different regions of the country. We have also been extremely privileged to have hosted a seminar by the respected Grand Master Leong Wai Meng in August last year.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the International Taekwon-Do Federation for its continued support. More in particular, I wish to commend you for your strong leadership and for your continuous efforts in strengthening our sport. As always be assured that the TFA fully support the activities of the organisation and that the TFA will continue to strive to unite all Taekwon-Do students on the continent of Africa.
